ST. KURIAKOSE ELIAS CHAVARA - OUR FOUNDER

Saint Kuriakose Elias Chavara was born on 10 February 1805 at Kainakary, Kerala. At the age of five he began his studies in a village school, called kalari. When he was 13, he joined the seminary at Pallipuram for his priestly training.

While he was in the seminary, his parents and his eldest brother died of an epidemic. On 29 November 1829, he became a priest.



Saint Chavara was instrumental in founding two Catholic Religious Congregations - one for men, Carmelites of Mary Immaculate (CMI), and the other for women, Congregation of Mother of Carmel (CMC), for the spiritual renewal and all round development of the society.

Starting seven ashrams and a convent in different parts of Kerala, Chavara initiated a spiritual movement among the people of Kerala. He established the first Catholic Sanskrit School, a major seminary and a printing & publishing house at Mannanam. He directed that every church should start a school attached to it and encouraged children even poorer sections to attend the schools by supplying midday meal and dress for them. He founded a '*Home of Charity*' to take of the destitute, the beggars, the uncared sick and the old. He also organized the first voluntary charitable association in Kerala for self-help among the needy.

Even in the midst of such manifold activities, he found time to write several literary and spiritual books in prose as well as verse. Among them, '*Anastasyayude Rakthasakshyam*' is the first narrative poem and '*Nalagamangal*' the first chronicle of history in Malayalam. He knew seven languages - Malayalam, Tamil, Sanskrit, Syriac, Latin, Italian and Portuguese.

Essentially, however, Saint Chavara was a man of prayer and great charity. He lived for 65 years and died on 3rd January 1871. His sanctity was first recognized by the Church, when Pope John Paul II beatified him at Kottayam (India) on 08 February 1986. Later, he was canonized a "saint" at Saint Peter's Square, Rome by Pope Francis, on 23 November 2014. Saint Chavara is the heavenly patron of all CMI and CMC institutions. Let us pray to him to intercede before God for all our needs, especially for success in our studies.

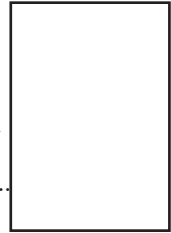

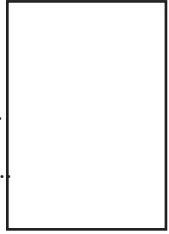

PROSPECTUS

THE CMI CONGREGATION

The Carmelites of Mary Immaculate (CMI) – the first-ever indigenous religious congregation for men in the Syrian Catholic tradition of Christianity in India. The CMI congregation, canonically established in 1855, played a major role in revolutionizing the education scene in Kerala in the late 19th century. Heirs to the profound vision of the Saint Kuriakose Elias Chavara, one of the founding fathers of the congregation, the CMIs’ have zealously worked towards providing value-based quality education to society at large, irrespective of religious differences, down the centuries.

Today, the CMI congregation is an active presence in five continents and twenty eight nations, with more than 3000 members, engaged in spreading the word of God, working relentlessly to strengthen the sacramental life of the people, undertaking the cause of the underprivileged and downtrodden, and revolutionizing the sphere of education with seats of learning markedly different in terms of academic excellence and social commitment. The congregation has at present more than four hundred and eighty educational institutions, ranging from nursery schools to professional colleges, research centers, and a deemed university spread across the world.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF LISIEUX SCHOOL

Lisieux Matriculation Higher Secondary School is owned by the Little Flower Education Society, established in 1972 under the Societies Registration Act and managed by the CMI (Carmelites of Mary Immaculate) Fathers of the Preshitha Province, Coimbatore, with its office at Little Flower Mission Centre. As part of the Lisieux Group of Institutions, the school carries forward an educational mission that began over five decades ago in Saibaba Colony, Coimbatore, and continues to thrive with a strong commitment to academic excellence and value-based education.

LISIEUX GROUP OF INSTITUTIONS

At present, there are four institutions bearing the Lisieux name - two located at Saibaba Colony and two at Saravanampatti, Coimbatore.

- **The Saibaba Colony campus** is home to Lisieux Matriculation Higher Secondary School (established in 1972) and Lisieux CMI International School (established in 2013).
- **At Saravanampatti**, the group also manages Lisieux CMI Public (CBSE) School and Lisieux College of Education, functioning under a different management within the same CMI congregation.

The Saibaba Colony campus, where the **Lisieux legacy** was born **55 years ago**, remains the heart of our educational mission. Both schools here are guided by the **CMI Fathers of Little Flower Monastery**, whose primary apostolate is education, and pastoral ministry at Little Flower Church, located within the campus.

Lisieux Matriculation Higher Secondary School follows the Tamil Nadu Matriculation curriculum, while **Lisieux CMI International School** offers the ICSE curriculum. Despite following distinct academic boards, both institutions share a common heritage, vision, and educational philosophy - **the Lisieux and CMI way of teaching and learning**.

Together, the Lisieux Group at Saibaba Colony serves nearly **3,600 students**, guided by over **200 dedicated staff members**. English remains the medium of instruction across both schools, ensuring strong linguistic proficiency and global communication skills.

HERITAGE OF LISIEUX

The name ‘Lisieux’ originates from a serene town in France - the hometown of our patron saint, St. Thérèse of Lisieux, who lived a life of profound holiness and simplicity. Though she lived only 24 years, spending most of her time within the walls of a Carmelite convent, her life continues to inspire millions across continents.

St. Thérèse never travelled the world, yet her message of love transcended borders. She believed that greatness does not lie in doing extraordinary deeds but in **doing small things with great love**. Her words, “*My vocation is love*” - remain the foundation of her spirituality. Through humble service, prayer, and countless small sacrifices for others, she became a living embodiment of divine love. Before her death, she declared with unwavering faith, “*After my death, I will let fall a shower of roses; I will spend my heaven doing good on earth.*” That spirit of love and service continues to inspire generations.



Drawing inspiration from St. Thérèse and her town of Lisieux, the **CMI Fathers** (Congregation of the **Carmelites of Mary Immaculate** founded by **St. Kuriakose Elias Chavara**) established the Lisieux Group of Institutions in Coimbatore over five decades ago. The mission was simple yet profound - **to spread the fragrance of love through quality education and service.**

The institution, which initially began under the CBSE curriculum, later embraced the Tamil Nadu Matriculation system to better serve the needs of the local community. Over the years, Lisieux has grown under the visionary leadership of dedicated principals, managers, and administrators who have continuously guided the school through progressive transformations in both curricular and co-curricular domains.

With well-equipped laboratories, a modern conference hall, a spacious auditorium, basketball and volleyball courts, and advanced computer labs, Lisieux continues to move forward on the path of innovation and excellence. The school has also hosted several International Education Conclaves (**EduCon**), and Edu-Fairs (**Pathfinder**) elevating its reputation and legacy to the global stage - a remarkable achievement for an institution that began as a humble Matriculation school.

The *Heritage of Lisieux* stands as a living testimony to its founding vision - to educate with love, to serve with compassion, and to grow with faith.

THE CMI VISION OF EDUCATION

Today, students are exposed to radical changes in outlook and lifestyle. They enjoy the conveniences of post-modernism, and are vested with power and knowledge. But they are not yet capable of ordering or prioritizing what they have learned and also they lack religious and moral points of reference.

Hence, our schools and other educational institutions vigorously pursue the goal of the all-round benefit of the students and of the society at large. They are committed to offer innumerable young people the opportunity of growing in faith, accepting and living the principles of truth, charity and hope. So our educational institutions should not merely be places for giving instructions to help the students to pass their exams, but a centre illumined by the Gospel message, fully attentive to the needs and aspirations of young people.

THE CMI EDUCATION POLICY

We, the Carmelites of Mary Immaculate, after the example of our founder St. Kuriakose Elias Chavara, consider education ‘The integral formation of the human person for the fulfillment of his/her individual and social responsibilities.’ Our educational endeavors aim at forming leaders who are intellectually competent, spiritually mature, morally upright, psychologically integrated, physically healthy and socially acceptable; who will champion the cause of justice, love, truth and peace and who are ever open to further growth.

The secret of the success of our educational institutions is a community of teachers who are committed to their vocation, professionally competent, morally upright, just and humane in dealings, and who grow in the true vision of education. We aspire towards creating a just and humane society where dignity of the human person is respected, where unjust social structures are challenged, where our cultural heritage of ahimsa, religious harmony and national integration is upheld, and where the poor and the marginalized are specially taken care of.

We have to reach out to the families, primarily of the students, to assist them in their needs, to share in their joys and sorrows, and to help them experience love and freedom so that the students realize that our educational institutions are an extension of their homes.

Our institutions are open to all students irrespective of caste and creed; they are accepted and cherished as they are and are helped to grow in their cultural, social and religious traditions. As they are privileged to be in our institutions, they will also have the right to get acquainted with the person of Jesus Christ and His Gospel. Being institutions established by and for a minority community based on religion, they will give preference to Christians in admissions and appointments and have a special concern for the faith formation of the Christian youth.

Our institutions are open to society at large by making their resources available for the ongoing education and non-formal teaching. For the realizations of this CMI goal of education, we expect students, parents and teachers to share this vision and to cooperate with us wholeheartedly.

PROFILE OF A STUDENT ADMITTED IN CMI INSTITUTION

Every student, enrolled in any of our institutions, should feel that s/he is a privileged person and is a special gift of God. As the word suggests, each of our students is expected to be:

The school aims at a high academic standard and stresses on co-curricular activities with ample opportunities provided to all to develop into rounded personalities.

ADMISSION

1. The academic year begins in April
2. Admissions are granted strictly on the basis of merit after conducting entrance test and interview.
3. A candidate who seeks admission has to submit the application form properly filled in.
4. At the time of admission, the following particulars are to be furnished.
 - a) Transfer Certificate countersigned by a proper authority
 - b) Conduct Certificate (for students from Grade 6 onwards)
 - c) Birth Certificate and Community Certificate
 - d) Mark Record Copy from previous school
5. The school authorities have the right to refuse admissions without assigning the reasons.

WITHDRAWAL

Application for a Transfer Certificate (TC) should be given to the Principal in writing. Those who intend to take TC at the end of the academic year will have to apply for it, along with the prescribed fee,

before the last date (Feb 28) given in the school calendar of each year. After this date, they will have to pay first term fee. TC will be issued only to those who have settled their dues. TC will not be issued during the academic year. If, in special cases, a student has to take TC during the academic year, s/he has to pay the whole year's fees.

UNIFORM

The school uniform is compulsory on all school days and at official school functions unless intimated otherwise.

Students without the prescribed uniform are not allowed to enter the classroom or the school premises during the class hours. They are liable to be sent home. It is the duty of the parents to see that their child does not go to school without proper uniform.

FACILITIES

- *Digital Interactive Classrooms with Animated Lessons:* Lisieux School stands unique with the digital classrooms and animated lessons.
- *Auditorium:* It has an auditorium, equipped with modern facilities like the LCD projector and audio visual facilities for effective learning and to satiate the students' quest for knowledge.
- *Library:* Our school is proud of having a well-furnished library with a good collection of student materials.
- *Computer Lab:* Well equipped computer labs with the necessary hardware and software is established to enable the students to face the present day social scenario with courage and confidence.
- *Science Labs:* Well equipped and advanced science labs (Physics, Chemistry and Biology) is a hallmark of our institution.
- *Play Grounds:* Spacious play grounds meant for the physical and emotional growth of the students are maintained. Indoor courts for basketball, shuttle badminton, futsal, table tennis, etc., are available.

PARENTS' RELATIONSHIP WITH SCHOOL

1. All the efforts by the teachers with regard to pupils' improvement can bear fruit only with the cooperation of the parents. LISIEUX prides of a very cooperative set of parents and feels blessed.
2. Parents and guardians are expected to co-operate with the school authorities by ensuring regularity and discipline, helping their children to prepare their lesson and study well.
3. Parents are invited to take helpful interest in the academic performance of the school and encourage their children to take part in co-curricular and extra curricular activities.
4. Parents are strongly recommended not to miss the opportunity of the monthly Parent-Teacher-Meeting (PTM) for enquiring about the progress of their children in studies and other aspects of school life.
5. Parents should ensure that:
 - a) Fees is paid as per schedule
 - b) Children attend school in the prescribed uniform and with the required materials, and
 - c) Children get enough time at home for preparing their lessons and doing their assignments.
6. Parents are earnestly requested to sign the report cards, circulars and similar documents whenever required. Failure of doing so may put their children and teacher in great inconvenience, and will result in the pupil being SENT HOME for which the school disclaims any responsibility whatsoever.
7. Private tuitions are discouraged. Staff members should not be compelled as private tutors for their children without the written permission of the Principal.
8. Parents are requested to co-operate with the teachers. They are recommended to contact the teachers concerned occasionally (on Fridays), with the prior permission of the Principal. Parents are not allowed to go to the classrooms and meet the teachers. Teachers will not entertain any parent while they are engaged in their duties.

9. Parents are requested not to compare a child with another as the students are of different backgrounds, abilities and interests.
10. It is quite natural that at times children may take complaints to their parents concerning school matters. Parents have to bring such cases to the notice of the Principal and the class teacher before coming to any hasty conclusions.
11. It is upto the parents to bring to the attention of the Principal and the teachers if their children have habits or traits of character or any other matters that need special care and attention.
12. Parents are requested to check the school diary on all working days and put their signature where required.
13. All payments should be made to the office and receipts (tuition fees) should be obtained and retained by the parents.
14. Parents should instruct their delegates who accompany their children not to wander in the school premises.
15. Instructions other than those in the diary will be sent via WhatsApp. Kindly ensure that you have given the correct mobile number in the school office.
16. The school facebook, website and instagram also give useful information.

PAYMENT OF FEES

1. Each student has to pay one year's fees towards establishment, examination, sports and games, Annual Day, News Paper, etc., along with the tuition fee (to be paid at the beginning of every academic year).
2. First Installment of fees must be paid on the prescribed days in the month of May, failure of which may result in the denial of permission to continue his/her further studies.
3. Books and other study materials have to be collected on or before the last date to pay the first term fee.
4. Term fee has to be paid before the last date specified for each term

in the school calendar.

5. Fees (whatever) once remitted in the office will not be refunded on any account.
6. The Management is vested with the right to revise the fees whenever required.
7. Fees defaulters will not be allowed to write the examinations.
8. Parents are given one month to pay their children's school fees.
9. School fees will incur a fine of ₹200 if not paid within one month. Thereafter, an additional fine of ₹100 will be charged for each subsequent month of delay.
10. The internal marks of your child may be impacted by late payments of school fees.

N.B. An additional fine of ₹100 will be charged for each subsequent month of delay.

EXAMINATIONS, TESTS AND REPORTS

1. Monthly (FA Exam - Formative Assessment) and Terminal (SA Exam - Summative Assessment) tests are obligatory. Any student who absents oneself except in the case of inability due to sickness and the like, will have to run the risk of being detained in the class. Requests for retests will not be considered.
2. Answer papers of all these examinations, except that of the annual, will be shown to the parents.
3. *Those who secure 50% (KG to G5) or 60% (G6 to G12) in all subjects will be eligible to secure a rank.*
4. Report cards, except that of the final, will be issued after each evaluation.

SUPPLEMENTARY EXAMINATION

1. The purpose of the supplementary examination in our school is to provide students (Grades 6–12: Middle School, High School, and Higher Secondary) who have not successfully passed the Formative and Summative Assessments with an additional opportunity to demonstrate their knowledge and understanding of the subject.
2. By offering this opportunity, the school aims to help students build confidence, strengthen their understanding of the subject, and achieve academic success. ***As part of this process, students are required to write the entire question paper along with the answers once again as an assignment (apart from the supplementary exam).***
3. Supplementary examinations are offered to students who have failed in one or more subjects. They are also compulsory for all absentees, irrespective of the reason (medical or casual).
4. Students must register for the supplementary examination immediately after the announcement of the FA/SA results.
5. Failure to attend the supplementary examination will adversely affect the student's internal marks and may impact their promotion to the next grade.
6. It is to be noted that the marks obtained in the supplementary examination will not be reflected in the report card, and such students will not be eligible for ranking.

INTERNAL MARKS

Internal marks are calculated based on various assessments and evaluations (curricular & co-curricular; monthly & termly) that take place throughout the academic year, which can include:

1. *Attendance*: This involves tracking a student's attendance and regular participation in class activities.
2. *Assignments, Take-home Test and homework*: These are tasks and projects assigned by the teacher to be completed outside of class, which can include written assignments, chart presentations, take-

home tests and so on.

3. *Library Book Summary*: Students are required to read any library book and submit a two-page summary every month in order to develop their reading habit.
4. *Notebook Completion*: Timely completion of classwork will be considered for evaluation.
5. *Discipline Management System (DMS)*: An assessment of a student's overall discipline, such as his or her academic ability, behavior, and co-curricular activities.
6. *Punctuality*: On-time arrival on campus adds points; late arrivals lose them.
7. *Payment of Fees*: Paying term fees on time adds points; late payments lose them.
8. *Formative Assessments (FA) & Class Tests*: These are exams that are given partway through the academic term, which are used to assess a student's understanding of the material covered up to that point.
9. *Practical Assessments & Viva*: These are assessments that evaluate a student's practical skills and abilities, such as in a lab, workshop, or performance-based class.

TAKE-HOME TEST

1. This is an 'open-book' exam at home for an hour (once a month – each subject) in which the student can refer to the textbook or notebook during the test, the questions being given the previous day.
2. Take-home test will be considered as Assignment-2
3. It should be submitted in an A4 sheet

CLASS TEST (ONCE A MONTH)

A 20-minute class test will be conducted once a month (second week) in each subject to assess students' understanding of the **topics covered during the first two weeks**. The marks obtained in these tests will be included in the internal assessment scores (No MCQs, or one marks will be given); the pattern can be changed according to grades).

PROMOTION

1. Pupils are promoted on the basis of the whole year's performance. Much importance is given to attendance (90%) and regularity in work. To be eligible to take the summative exams (SA1, SA2 & SA3), *a student without 90% attendance must submit an assignment (of two pages) for each subject.*
2. Promotion is strictly based on securing the minimum percentage of 50% (Pre-KG to G5) or 60% (G6-G12) in the subjects for all examinations.
3. Results of the detained or conditionally promoted or defaulters will not be published on the notice board.
4. The results that are declared at the end of the final examinations will not be reconsidered and no detained student will be given a T.C.
5. A student who fails twice in the same class will not be allowed to continue his studies in the school.
6. Promotion to Grades 8, 9, and 10 is strictly based on academic performance and the overall conduct of the student.
7. Students must secure a pass mark in all subjects to be eligible for promotion to Grade 10. No re-examination will be conducted for students who fail to meet this requirement.

8. Students who do not qualify for promotion will be required to obtain a Transfer Certificate (TC).

RULES OF GOOD CONDUCT

Preamble

Lisieux Matriculation Higher Secondary School believes that discipline is the foundation of character formation and academic excellence. A well-disciplined environment helps students develop responsibility, respect, self-control and leadership qualities. Every student of the school is therefore expected to conduct himself or herself with dignity, sincerity and integrity at all times.

The following rules are framed to ensure an orderly and harmonious school environment. All Lisieuxites+ are expected to observe these rules faithfully and uphold the good name and traditions of Lisieux School.

1. Punctuality and School Timings

a) All students must strictly adhere to the school timings.

Monday – Friday:

Pre-KG to Grade 7 : 08.25 a.m. – 04.05 p.m.

G8 to G12 : 08.25 a.m. – 04.40 p.m.

Remedials (G8-G12) : 07.30 a.m. - 04.40 p.m.

Remedials (G1-G7) : 08.25 a.m. - 04.40 p.m.

Saturday:

Grade 1 to Grade 12 : 08.25 a.m. – 12.45 p.m.

Remedials : Same as other days

b) Third Saturday is a holiday.

c) Students must be present in their classrooms by 08.30 a.m. with all required learning materials.

d) The warning bell rings at 08.37 a.m. and the morning prayer begins at 08.40 a.m. School gates will be closed after the warning bell.

e) Students attending remedial classes must report to school by 07.30 a.m.

f) Punctuality is a mark of discipline. Students who come late must submit a written explanation from their parents. Repeated late coming will invite disciplinary action.

2. Morning Prayer and School Assembly

- a) All students must participate in the morning prayer with respect, devotion and discipline.
- b) The school assembly is conducted daily at 09.25 a.m..
Monday, Wednesday & Friday (KG2 – Auditorium; Grade 7 to Grade 12 – School Ground)
Tuesday, Thursday & Saturday (KG1 – Auditorium; Grade 1 to Grade 6 – School Ground)
- c) Students must assemble and disperse in proper lines, maintaining silence and discipline.

3. Conduct in the Classroom

- a) The classroom is a place meant exclusively for learning and must be treated with respect.
- b) Students must maintain silence and discipline inside the classroom.
- c) Students shall greet the teacher when he or she enters the class and thank the teacher when the class ends.
- d) No student shall enter the class after the lesson has begun or leave the classroom without the permission of the teacher.
- e) During class hours students must not wander in corridors or disturb other classes.

4. Movement within the Campus

- a) Students must maintain line discipline while entering the campus, attending assembly, or moving within the school.
- b) While moving to restrooms, the canteen or other areas, students must walk in line and follow the instructions of PET instructors and duty staff.
- c) During break time, students must not move in groups in an undisciplined manner.
- d) Loud shouting, whistling or creating disturbances within the campus is strictly prohibited.

5. Attendance and Leave

- a) Students must maintain a minimum of 85% attendance to appear for the Quarterly, Half-Yearly and Annual examinations.
- b) Leave must be applied in writing in advance.
- c) After returning from leave, students must submit the leave letter

signed by the parent or guardian.

- d) Medical leave must be supported with a medical certificate.
- e) Students who take leave for more than one day must meet the Principal along with their parents and show completed class notes.
- f) Students absent for more than five consecutive days without permission may have their names removed from the rolls.

6. Uniform and Grooming

- a) Students must come to school neatly dressed in the prescribed school uniform on all working days.
- b) Personal hygiene and grooming must be maintained according to school standards.
- c) Hair must be properly trimmed at regular intervals.
- d) Students who violate uniform or grooming rules will be sent home to rectify the violation, and have to come and attend the classes.

7. Language Policy

- a) English shall be spoken within the school premises at all times.
- b) Tamil shall be spoken only during the Tamil period.

8. Electronic Gadgets and Prohibited Items

- a) Students are strictly prohibited from bringing mobile phones or electronic gadgets to school.
- b) Any such item found will be confiscated and returned only at the end of the academic year.
- c) Books or materials unrelated to school studies may not be brought to school without the permission of the Principal.

9. Behaviour and Respect

- a) Students must show respect and courtesy to all members of the staff.
- b) Students must behave properly both inside and outside the school campus, upholding the dignity of the institution.
- c) Borrowing or lending money and exchanging personal belongings are not permitted.
- d) Disturbing other classes under any pretext is strictly prohibited.

10. Care of School Property

- a) Students must respect and safeguard school property.
- b) Writing on walls, damaging furniture or defacing school property is strictly prohibited.

- c) Any damage caused must be fully compensated by the student concerned.

11. Safety and Personal Belongings

- a) The school will not be responsible for the loss of personal belongings.
- b) Students must not bring valuables such as expensive watches, ornaments or other costly items.
- c) Every student must bring the school diary daily.

12. Lunch and Parent Visits

- a) Students must bring their lunch from home.
- b) Students are not permitted to go home for lunch.
- c) Parents are not allowed to visit students or bring lunch during school hours.

13. Participation in School Activities

- a) Attendance at all official school programmes is compulsory.
- b) Students are expected to participate actively in school activities and develop team spirit, leadership and a sense of service.
- c) Students will study Tamil, Hindi, English and Computer Science from Grade I onwards.

14. Dispersal and After-School Conduct

- a) Dispersal timings are as follows:
 - Pre-KG – Grade 7 : 04.05 p.m.
 - Grade 8 – Grade 12 : 04.40 p.m.
- b) Students must leave the campus in an orderly manner after dispersal.
- c) Students must proceed directly home after school and should not remain in or around the campus.

15. Safety Regulations

- a) Parents are advised not to allow minors to ride motorbikes to school.
- b) Students without valid driving licences are not permitted to bring bikes to school.
- c) Any reckless behaviour such as racing or disturbing the public will be reported to the authorities (police).
- d) Any involvement in illegal activities such as drug abuse will lead to strict disciplinary action (intimation to police) including dismissal from the school.

Discipline today shapes the leaders of tomorrow. Every Lisieuxite is expected to live this value with honour and responsibility.

VIOLATIONS OF STUDENT CODE OF CONDUCT

It is necessary to provide the school personnel, parents and students with a clear understanding of the different grades of violations of school rules and the consequent disciplinary actions.

The following lists categorize and define certain violations that will disrupt the school environment and institutional progress, and specify the disciplinary measures the Principal is likely to initiate. Any disciplinary action at the discretion of the Principal will depend on the severity and frequency of the student's misdemeanour.

Violations:

The lists of violations on the following pages are not really all-comprehensive, but only representative and illustrative. Thus, a student committing an impropriety which is not mentioned in the lists, can still be subjected to disciplinary action, if his offence is judged to be of serious enough nature.

LEVEL I VIOLATIONS:

A level I violation is defined to be any behaviour which in some way can offend the sanctity of the educational establishment that is considered as a temple of knowledge and learning.

- Not showing due respect to school authorities and teachers.
- Discourtesy in general, disruptive and rude behaviour in class, disturbing teacher/other students in the class by talking, not paying attention to the teachers, sleeping in the class, unauthorized movement in class, unauthorized absence from class, improper language, lying, inappropriate dress and grooming, leaving the school without permission, speaking in vernacular on campus and so on.

First Disciplinary Intervention:

- Discussion between teacher and student
- Student referred to coordinator, if necessary.
- Student submits a written apology to the class teacher/coordinator.

Second Disciplinary Intervention:

- Discussion between Teacher, Student, Coordinator, Vice Principal/Academic Director and Principal.
- Submission of student's apology and Vice Principal/Academic Director's report to the Principal's Office.
- Record maintained in Principal's Office, and parent notification

Third Disciplinary Intervention:

- Parent notification through Principal followed by a brief suspension (3 days).
- Student will get back to the Vice Principal/Academic Director for discussion at an appointed time and date.
- Student may be asked to do community service/additional project/subject related work, service-oriented tasks.

LEVEL II VIOLATIONS:

A Level II violation is any behaviour which seriously disrupts or interferes with the effective functioning of the school.

Serious lying, stealing, bullying, ragging, teasing, disturbing and distracting the students belonging to the opposite sex, damaging school property or belongings of another, misuse of internet facility (creating or viewing objectionable text or graphics, hacking other sites or e-mail addresses), borrowing and taking money from fellow students, inappropriate display of affection, racist comments, profanity, obscene gestures and language, physical violence, fistfights with other students, causing serious injuries, unruly behaviour, spreading bad rumours, unhealthy association with companions, malpractice during exams, forging signature, being disrespectful to a teacher, swearing at a teacher,

threatening a teacher etc., malpractice in the exam include copying, helping others to copy in exams, exchanging answer papers, writing answers on the question papers and involving by other malpractices such as altering marks and using mobile phones and other electronic devices on the school campus.

(N.B. It is not permitted for students to use mobile phones and other electronic devices on the school campus. Devices that are confiscated will not be returned.)

First Disciplinary Intervention:

- Time out from class (to library)
- Discussion between Teacher, Vice Principal/Academic Director and Principal, Parent Notification
- Submission of student's apology and teacher's report to the Vice Principal/Academic Director
- Record of report maintained in Principal's Office
- Counselling (2 Sessions)
- Suspension – 3 days/Dismissal (at the discretion of the Principal) and submission of 5 pages assignment.
- The suspended student may be allowed to return to class after getting the necessary written assurances from the student and the parent.

Second Disciplinary Intervention:

- This measure is taken against a student who has already gone through the first disciplinary intervention and then taken back, but repeats the same misdemeanour or commits another serious offence.
- Time out from class (to library)
- Submission of student's apology and teacher's report to the Vice Principal/Academic Director
- Parent Notification and Counselling (2 sessions)
- Dismissal/7 Days' Suspension (at the discretion of the Principal)
- Students will compensate any wilful damage to property and access to facilities will be withdrawn. In addition, the student will be given additional project/subject related work and service-oriented tasks.

LEVEL III VIOLATIONS:

A Level III violation is considered to be any misbehaviour of an aggravated nature which perilously disrupts or interferes with the effective functioning of the school.

- Such serious violation would include bringing dangerous weapons (e.g. knife/guns) to school, sexual misconduct, use of narcotic drugs or possession of drug paraphernalia, consumption of alcohol, smoking, chewing pan masala, and other unhealthy practices that are punishable under legal and educational rules.

Disciplinary Intervention:

- Time out from class (to library)
- Discussion between Teacher, Vice Principal/Academic Director and the Principal
- Submission of student's apology and teacher's report to the Vice Principal/Academic Director
- Record of report maintained in the Principal's Office
- Parent & Police Notification
- Immediate Dismissal

Please Note:

Sexual Offences, Use of Drugs, Alcohol, Smoking, Unauthorized Photography/Video Shooting and Posting Photos/ Videos taken in school on the internet/ Social media, and other such extreme offences will attract Zero Tolerance from the part of the Administration and can result in instant Disciplinary Action such as suspension/ dismissal.

ANY STUDENT IDENTIFIED FOR INDULGING IN MISCONDUCT OF VERY DAMAGING NATURE WILL BE DISMISSED IMMEDIATELY FROM THE SCHOOL WITH APPROPRIATE TRANSFER CERTIFICATE INDICATING THE NATURE OF THE OFFENCE.

Objectives:

- Resolve student concerns impartially and promptly.
- Identify and address root causes of student dissatisfaction.
- Educate students on their rights and responsibilities.

Procedures:

- Submit grievances in writing.
- Follow the escalation process: Class Teacher -> Academic Director -> Principal

SCHOOL LIBRARY RULES

1. All pupils and members of the staff are members of the library.
2. Pupils are allowed to borrow only one book at a time and can retain it for a period of one week. If needed, the librarian may call for a book borrowed by any member even before the expiry of the normal period of a week.
3. Reference books cannot be taken out of the library.
4. If the book borrowed is not returned to the library by the due date, a fine of Re. 5 per day will be imposed.
5. Borrowers should not pass on the books to others.
6. Books borrowed should be kept neatly. No marking, underlining or damage to the book is allowed.

7. Books that are lost, damaged or wrongly handled will have to be paid for or replaced. The decision by the librarian, in consultation with the Principal, in this matter will be final.
8. Library books will be issued from the 15th of June. All books borrowed should be returned to the library by 20th March every year to facilitate annual stock verification. There will be no issuing of books during summer vacation.
9. Strict silence should be observed in the Library.
10. Students should maintain a record of the books in their diary.

POLICY FOR STUDNETS WHO FAIL IN EXAMINATIONS

1. To pass in a subject during an examination, a student must score a minimum of 60% marks (Grades 6–12) or 50% marks (KG–Grade 5).
2. Students who fail in any subject will be required to attend supplementary examinations until they obtain the required pass mark in that subject.
3. In addition to the supplementary examination, the student will be required to write the question paper and answers of that subject twice as part of the corrective academic process.
4. The marks obtained in the supplementary examination will not appear in the report card, but will be reflected in the internal marks of the subsequent examination.
5. As part of the procedure for the supplementary examination, the student must submit a permission letter addressed to the Principal through the subject teacher before appearing for the exam.

REMEDIAL CLASSES FOR ACADEMIC SUPPORT

1. Students who fail in examinations, as well as those identified as academically weak by the Academic Council, are required to compulsorily attend remedial classes for a period of one month.
2. The remedial class schedule will be as follows:
 - **Grades 1–7:** 4.00 p.m. to 4.40 p.m.
 - **Grades 8–12:** 7.30 a.m. to 8.30 a.m. (as they have normal classes till 04.40 pm).

3. These classes are intended to provide additional academic support and guidance to help students strengthen their understanding and improve their performance.
4. Attendance in remedial classes is mandatory for all students who are required to attend them. Parents and students are expected to extend their full cooperation in ensuring regular attendance.
5. Failure to attend these remedial classes or lack of cooperation from parents and students may seriously affect the student's academic continuation in the following academic year.

PARENT-TEACHER ASSOCIATION (PTA)

1. All parents are members of the Parent- Teacher association of the school. The aims and objectives of the association are:

 - c) To have better understanding of the problems of the pupils, parents, teachers and help to find solution.
 - d) To raise funds for the specific purpose of school’s welfare.
2. It is not possible to have periodical general body meeting. Hence a core committee known as the executive committee of 5 to 10 members will be constituted each year by the management in consultation with the PTA president.
3. The executive committee of the PTA is expected to meet periodically.

PARENT-TEACHERS MEETING (PTM)

1. The purpose of parent-teacher meetings in schools is to provide an opportunity for parents and teachers to communicate and collaborate regarding the education and well-being of the student.
2. Some of the specific objectives of parent-teacher meetings include: Sharing information about student’s academic progress, social and emotional development, and any concerns that either party may have. It can help build positive relationships between parents and teachers.
3. It is mandatory for all parents to meet the class teachers of their children every month.

TALENTS’ DAY

1. The purpose of Talents’ Day in schools is to provide a platform for students to showcase their unique skills and talents outside of the academic curriculum.

2. It is to celebrate the diversity of students' interests and abilities, promote a positive and inclusive school culture, foster self-confidence, encourage students to pursue their passions, and support the holistic development of students.
3. Talents' Day is held on any saturday; In this event, students of a class present their talents for an hour, and one of the teachers will be the chief guest.

AMENDMENTS OF RULES
